Advancing Our Care for the Sexual Assault Patient Registration and Scholarship Information

Due to funding restrictions, registrants from Minnesota are preferred. Out-of-state registrants may be placed on a waiting list. Scholarship awards are restricted to Minnesota residents or individuals who provide care to sexual assault patients within Minnesota. We will make every attempt to honor scholarship requests. In order to accommodate as many requests as possible, a scholarship award may be a complete or partial award of the original request.

Scholarships are available to cover the following costs:

- Lodging at the Best Western Kelly Inn, 161 St. Anthony Avenue in St. Paul MN, for the nights of Wednesday, October 6 and/or Thursday, October 7. **If awarded, lodging will be paid for by the scholarship recipient up front.**
- Mileage in excess of 150 miles roundtrip to attend the training. **If awarded, mileage will be reimbursed to the scholarship recipient.**

Scholarships are NOT available to cover the following costs:

- Registration fee of \$40.
- Per diem for meals or incidentals. Please note that breakfast and lunch on October 7 are included with the registration fee.
- Reimbursement for time taken off work to attend the training.
- Taxi or bus fare from hotel to training location. Please note that a shuttle will be provided from the Best Western Kelly Inn to the training location and back on October 7.

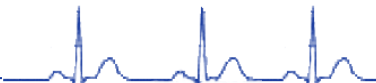
Deadlines

Registration with Scholarship Request

Registrations with scholarship requests must be submitted or postmarked by **August 5, 2010**. Scholarship recipients will be notified of their award via email by August 16, 2010. Scholarship requests submitted or postmarked after August 5, 2010 will still be considered but will not receive preference. Scholarship requests submitted after August 5, 2010 will be processed on a first come, first served basis if funds remain.

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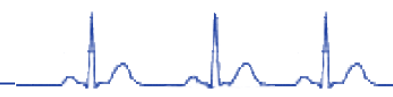
